Project Completion | Inkerman Gas Collection System



The Inkerman Gas Collection System (GCS) expansion has reached completion, with us successfully installing 59 landfill gas (LFG) extraction wells, spanning over 5 kilometres of flow, lateral and header lines, and a highly efficient condensate management system.

This upgrade has significantly amped up our LFG capture, positioning us favourably for the next steps in enhancing its utilisation.

Our journey wasn't without its fair share of challenges, especially as we worked through the winter months. Nevertheless, our dedicated team's resilience and unwavering commitment ensured the project's success.

We also owe a debt of gratitude to the strong partnership we forged with the Cleanaway operations team. Together, we tackled and conquered challenges with a positive outlook.

Our focus now turns to the ongoing operation and maintenance of the landfill, ensuring that both LFG and leachate aspects are meticulously managed to the highest standards.
